Quick Update on the 4th Street Property

Things are progressing on the 4th Street Property and a quick pace. We will have the house open for the Historic Baker City Parlour Tour for full tours of the house. Tickets supporting HBC are on sale at Crossroads (\$15.00 for adult, \$12.00 for Sr. or Students or \$10.00 a person for groups of 10 or more.) We will have the Parlour decorated for the Holidays—the Parlour Doors are up! A huge thank you to Slade Elbert, Bob Savage, Victor Savage, Kerry Savage, Mary Tomlinson and the Goodrich Family for donating the furniture.

We have painted the kitchen and are the process of finishing the remodel there. Thank you to George Broderick and Terry Strehlou for donating a refrigerator, a washer and dryer for the kitchen. Thank you to Bob Savage, Marie Savage and Kerry Savage for helping with painting. George and Terry have donated a bed and some additional furniture for the house.

We will have the electricians and plumbers in as this goes to press. We thank Mike and Charlene Chase for donating a hot water tank so we can replace the two small ones and go to just one large one.

If you have furniture you would like to donate—the following things we need:

WHAT'S NEXT?

Well the board has tasked me to write a business plan for the 4th Street Property if Crossroads were to keep the property. I have been working with Restore Oregon and Restore Idaho, been meeting with local partners and looking at opportunities for the property.

The board has also asked me to explore options for them if we were to sell the property. We continue to make the needed improvements to the property to do either one of those options. I am working at that as quickly as I can as I move into a new grant writing season. At this point once the basic updates are made to make the property habitable are done we may be looking for a short term renter.

If you want to see the property we invite you to join Parlour Tour I will be giving tours all day and will have our copy of the book about the house available for you to look at. It's a wonderful property so come and see it!

This is a great time, at years end, for those last minute contributions to Crossroads including the Hand to Heart Scholarship Fund which you can match with a donation to the Oregon Cultural Trust for significant tax savings. OCT donations must be made by December 31, 2016. Your contributions will help with the increased demands on the scholarship fund we expect in 2017.

Changes to Crossroads Education Programs

I want to thank Debbie Friedman, Paul Hoelscher, Mary Sue Rightmire and Becky Litke for working with Crossroads to revise the teachers contract, pay structure and policies and procedures. These changes were accepted by the Board of Directors on November 16th they will go in effective on January 1, 2017. If we have advertised a class nothing for our customers or teachers will change but for all ongoing classes and new classes the changes are in effect January 1st.

JUSTIFICATION FOR THE CHANGES

Since moving into the Carnegie Library Building in 2008, little to no action has occurred in regards to payment, policies and the teachers contract. Part of the justification was the recession and it was critical that Crossroads remain open and functioning as best as possible. Crossroads and our teachers face increases in inflation that impact everyone's bottom line. Crossroads must look at every option to assure our programs run efficiently, are affordable to our students and assure that the costs of Crossroads Carnegie Art Center are met.

DEFINITIONS

Ongoing Classes – These are classes that occur at the same time each week and our Crossroads critical entry level classes. These classes are paid by students weekly or monthly.

Scheduled Classes – Any class that Crossroads offers that has a clear beginning and end. These classes can be once or twice a week for a specific number of weeks.

Weekend Workshops – these classes are usually 2 days of instruction on the weekend. This is traditionally intermediate to advanced art instruction with a goal of attracting out of town guests to Baker City for classes thereby making the classes available to our local market.

POLICY CHANGES EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1ST THAT IMPACT OUR STUDENTS

- The Calculation of the non-member rate will be the same regardless of type of class. Teacher will set a member rate and the non-member rate will be the member rate plus 50%. Example: Class tuition is \$100 for members the non-member rate will be \$150
- Ongoing Adult Classes – all students will charge \$16.00 for 2 hours of instruction member rate \$24.00 for non members.
- Scheduled Classes – students will pay \$5.00 an hour and class tuition will now be set on instructional hours. Example: A 16 hour class you will pay \$80.00 for the class as a member (16 hours x \$5.00 an hour) and a non member will pay \$120.00.
- Attendance will be taking at every class so show up a few minutes early!
- Ongoing Classes will have regular substitutes so that if the instructor is ill or out of town class will continue.
- Participant's registration forms will be filled out yearly by all students regardless of age.

- There will be no pro-ration of classes for any reason.
- All classes must be paid or scholarship form turned in to hold a space in a class. Students must pay all class fees prior to the class – Monday thru Saturday 10:00am to 5:00pm, mail in, call in or hopefully in 2017 Crossroads will have the ability to pay online. Teachers will no longer accept payment at Classes.
- Refund policy – If a student leaves a class they will be charged the cost of the class instruction received and then receive the balance. This must occur within 14 days after the first day of the class. If your registration creates the minimum number of students for the class and you cancel you may not receive a refund without the approval of the Executive Director.
- The Executive Director and the teacher will work together to make the best decision for the group to cancel a class. Teachers retain the right to list a minimum of students they will teach. But Crossroads reserves the right, for the good of our program to ask the teacher to teach the class. In the case of dance classes minimum class participation will be strictly enforced-teachers will be encouraged to have private lessons.
- If the instructor is from outside of Baker County – if the minimum has not been met 7 days in advance of the class the class will be cancelled.
- For scheduled classes if a teacher gets sick during a scheduled class a makeup class will be scheduled.

WE WANT TO BE CLEAR

If you currently take classes and these small increases make taking a class unaffordable please let your teacher and the ED know. The Hand to Heart Scholarship Fund at Crossroads is available as our students adjust their budgets to the new norm. Scholarships can be given for part of the class costs if you need it. Please do not stop taking classes...we want to assure you that we take very seriously our motto: Art For Everyone.

Please note at this time these changes will only be for adult classes. A small cadre of instructors will meet with me to find funding streams that will help underwrite our youth instruction so that we can reach more kids and find an equitable way to fund high quality instruction.

HOW YOU CAN HELP?

Please take the classes we offer- if we had 100% enrollment in the classes we do offer these kind of changes would be minor. Teach a class if you can – if we had more instructors willing to come and teach a class our margins become less of an issue.

The other critical part of this is that you all see the value of membership. I dream of a day where there is only one rate for classes I need to worry about MEMBER rate because you are all – our entire community are members of Crossroads.

You are invited as local and regional artists to submit artwork to our April Open Regional Show titled, "The Path of Totality." This year's theme is based on the upcoming total solar eclipse which will cross over Baker City on August 21, 2017. We want to encourage artists to explore the theme from any angle which they choose. Artists may be inspired literally by celestial ideas and others may be inspired by the title and the implications of the words, or combination of words.

Some ideas to ponder, to start your mind wandering...Solar eclipse, celestial gaze, ethereal reflection, elusive, ring of fire, luminous moon, alignment of moon earth & sun, diamond ring effect, the moon's aphetic silhouette glides across the sun's face, celestial show, path in forest, personal growth, design-abstract or not, shadows and light, what is hiding, what is not hiding, what is peeking out, total-the idea of all in, committed, the whole of it, black hole, syzygy (a conjunction or opposition, especially of the moon with the sun, a nearly straight-line configuration of 3 celestial bodies, as the sun, moon & earth during a solar eclipse), total eclipse of the sun, a path, what does totality mean, darkness and light...We are looking forward to seeing your original ideas and how you interpret the theme.
