YOUTH/TEEN POTTERY STUDIO

Course Description: Attention Junior High and High School Students! This class is for you! This class is geared toward learning to use the wheel to throw vessels for functional and artistic forms. No previous experience required. New students will learn basic clay handling with pinch, slab, coil and hand pulling techniques, then move to the wheel. We will learn to fit lids, add handles and decorative elements to our work.

Order of progression-

- 1 Basic clay bodies and handling. We learn the nature of clay and its stages from plastic to vitrified. Pinch, coil and slab techniques are applied to our first projects.
- 2 Building vessels. Managing clay on the wheel, including centering, opening and pulling.
- 3 Shaping, altering and decorating. Geometric and organic shapes created with various tools, texturing and slip decorating.
- 4 Glazing- under glazes and medium fire glazes are available. We also use wax resist and sgraffito techniques to personalize our work.

Final firing is at month's end and it is the responsibility of the student to pick up their work 2 weeks from the class end date.

CLAY AS CANVAS

Instructor: Shanna Fliegel, Billings Montana

Start date: Saturday August 3rd and Sunday August 4th

Course Description: I will demonstrate how to use press, drape and slump molds to create dimensional tiles/sculptural forms to illustrate, while taking into consideration hanging techniques for the wall. We will use a red earthenware and experiment with slips, underglazes and mason stains on the unfired surface. Sgraffito will be demonstrated as a way to incorporate drawn imagery, while stencils, and "thermo-faxes" (a simple screen-printing technique) will embellish the surface with stylized design elements. We'll discuss the power of imagery and story, and how to consider composition and line quality.

Crossroads is honored to welcome Shanna Fliegel to teach a two day pottery workshop in Baker City. Shanna's work was part of the "Persistence in Clay: Contemporary Ceramics in Montana" show at Crossroads in the summer of 2012. Her work was so popular; Crossroads invited her to be a Featured Artist in August. Shanna has graciously agreed to extend her trip to teach—extending the impact of the Persistence in Clay show on Eastern Oregon.

Instructor Shanna Fliegel grew up in Northwest New Jersey surrounded by animals. After graduating with her BFA in Ceramics from James Madison University she went on to complete two residencies at the Cub Creek Foundation in Appomattox, VA and Greenwich House Pottery in New York. Drawing and painting was her first love and she continued to search for the perfect marriage of image and clay while completing her MFA at Southern Illinois University. After graduate school Shanna had the opportunity to work as a resident and teacher at the Clay Art Center in Port Chester, NY and as a summer resident at the Archie Bray Foundation in Helena, MT. Shanna is currently teaching at Montana State University in Billings. Over the past few years Shanna's work has been shown at the 2009 NCECA Biennial, the 2010 NCECA Invitational and featured as an emerging artist in Ceramic Monthly.

Images are created through various applications of professional water-based inks that can be rolled, brushed, dabbed and manipulated on a plexiglass plate, then transferred to quality printmaking paper with the use of an etching press. We’ll also explore ways to introduce textures, text and collage. This is a “jump in and lose yourself” workshop suitable for all levels.
